Often known as John O' Gaunt's Castle, Lancaster Castle is one of the most historically interesting buildings in Lancashire. Explore the Judges' Lodgings and experience where the Judges lived with their staff throughout the trials and executions. Read the fascinating stories about the people who were tried, convicted, acquitted or executed at Lancaster. Explore over 600 shields of all the Sovereigns of England and of all the Constables of Lancaster Castle and High Sheriffs of Lancashire known to have borne arms. Many hundreds of people were sentenced to transportation in the Courts at Lancaster Castle. Could you be descended from one of these people?

We are happy to receive enquiries from schools throughout the year. Our guided tours offer students the opportunity to see one of the last working castles in the country, learn about the administration of the law through the last 1,000 years, and experience for themselves what it meant to be imprisoned here.

Tours run daily between 10:30am and 4:00pm. Their frequency during the day depends on the use of the castle by the crown court, but all tours last 1 hour, and if you have any special subject that you would like discussed just let us know.

The cost to schools is £2.50 per head, with 1 adult admitted free for every 10 children and any other adults charged at the child rate.

HAIGH COUNTRY PARK



The Wardens team at Haigh provides an education and interpretation facility for the public and organised groups. On offer are a wide variety of events and activities to introduce people to the woodlands and history of Haigh Country Park, which can be pre-booked in advance of your visit. Whether the trip is educational or just for fun, the Wardens can make your day a success. By working closely with schools, the Wardens can provide group teaching on environment issues as part of the National Curriculum. The Wardens can take school groups on guided walks through the forest where pupils are encouraged to use their senses to make their own discoveries. Themed walks to fit in with schoolwork or a particular area of interest include:

- History Tour - A tour of the Hall and other points of historical interest can be made by special arrangement
- Nature and the Seasons - Life cycles, species interdependence, food cycles and earth walks
- Mini-Beasts - The fascinating world of mini-beasts. Nature viewers and magnifiers provided
- Pond Life - A close look at the creatures that live in water with equipment provided. There are many areas of study available to Secondary Schools and Colleges. Subjects like Biology, Geology, Geography and History can come to life at Haigh.

Students in further or higher education may find Haigh useful for project work, research or site visits. We may be able to help students identify areas for study in subjects such as Leisure and Environmental Studies.

Lancaster Maritime Museum



Within the setting of two original Georgian quayside buildings, your pupils are given the opportunity to step back in time. Through active participation, role-play and object handling sessions, your pupils will discover and explore over 1000 years of local history from Viking settlers to Lancaster and Morecambe's rich maritime past from its involvement in the Transatlantic Slave Trade to holiday fun.

Activities

The Vikings are Coming!

Your pupils will be taken back to 955AD where they will be subject to Viking Law and customs. They will be invited into the heart of the settlement then taken to the home of Linden; she will demonstrate the Viking way of life and offer children the opportunity to participate directly in the home life and daily work chores of the 'Lancashire' settlement. They will also meet a Viking Warrior who will instruct them in all things Viking' farming, crafts, wood-working, sailing, navigation and fighting! These sessions are fully hands on and extremely entertaining taking your pupils on a journey where they experience life in Lancashire over 1000 years ago!

KS1, KS2

Holidays in Morecambe (1hr)

Your pupils will be taken to a Fisherman's cottage where a guest staying there will be waiting to greet them and take them back in time. The group will gain an awareness of many aspects of holidays in the past and local history of the area. The group will be able to handle original and replica artefacts. The group will also experience through active participation a variety of fun activities relating to holidays 'then and now,' including literacy, craft sessions, role-play and seaside games.

KS1, KS2

Trade, People, Profits (2hrs)

Your pupils will follow a local history trail that takes them through the Museums Custom House and outside along the Quayside. They will follow in the footsteps of Lancaster's forgotten past and its involvement in the Transatlantic Slave Trade. This session also covers other aspects of Lancaster's local history and development.
